Branch News

- Carpeting project in Lindsay Circulation and Program department was completed. Lindsay Circulation reopened to the public September 16. Lindsay Programs pop up space was set up in Meeting Room during temporary closure of Program department. Lindsay Programs had a soft reopening on October 19.
- Construction to the parking lot and land around **Dalton branch** was completed at the end of October.
- Improvement to the entrance ramp at Kirkfield branch took place October 28-30. In addition, several dead trees were cut down and removed from this location.

Programs, Outreach and Partnerships

Programs/Services

- National Day of Truth and Reconciliation was honoured on Monday, September 30th. On Saturday September 28, all branches offered activities for both kids and adults. Lindsay branch also offered two reconciliation sessions that included a smudge ceremony.
- This school year, the Library will offer exciting programs on **PA days**. The first PA Day was Friday, October 25. Programs will be available at all open branches, with a different program happening each PA day.
- Rainbow Families a new library-supported community get-together targeted for 2SLGBTQIA+ families, but welcoming to all – commenced October 19 at Lindsay branch. This event was well attended with families asking for continued monthly dates
- **Bobcaygeon** branch has launched a **Homeschool STEM** program with activities for children who learn from home
- One-on-one tech support sessions are now offered at all branches. Staff will
 provide dedicated learning sessions to library patrons seeking support on how to
 operate new tablets, smart phones and various computer software systems.
 These free 30 minute sessions can be booked in advance and are offered every
 month.

Outreach

Library staff made seven presentations to all grade 9 L.C.V.I students.
 Specifically highlighted in this presentation was how students can receive volunteer hours by volunteering at the library.

- During the Lindsay branch closure, library staff hosted three pop-up story times during, once at Edwin Binney's Community Garden and twice at Logie Park.
- Library staff attended *The CKL Wellness Fair* at the Armories on September 25.
 The library's active living collection, community passes, cognitive kits, as well as sensory support kits, were all promoted at this event.
- The library hosted an information booth at the *International Plowing Match*.
 The library table displayed items from the physical collection as well as items from the Library of Things collection. Pictures from our digital archive were also on display. The library was located in the Educational Building with many kids from surrounding communities bussed in for this event.
- Library staff coordinated 5 care home visits in September and October at Case Manor and Aspira in Bobcaygeon as well as William Place, Frost Manor and Caressent Care in Lindsay.

Partnerships

- **CKL Heritage Development Officer** has been visiting all library branches this fall to promote the City's Archaeological Plan.
- **Fire Prevention Week** was October 6th October 12th. The Library collaborated with Kawartha Lakes Fire Rescue to offer programs at the **Bobcaygeon** and **Lindsay** branches.
- The Lindsay and Bobcaygeon branches hosted the3rd Annual Kawartha Lakes Book Festival on October 26. The event helps celebrate and promote local authors.
- The library has submitted a proposal to secure a grant through The
 Commonwell LEAF project. Any funds received will go towards equipping the
 Creativity Lab in former Kawartha Art Gallery Space. Several patrons have left
 supportive comments on our proposal webpage.
