Branch News

- **Lindsay branch** will be closed August 31 to September 14 as carpet is replaced. Minor renovations to the Children's/Program department will result in a further two-week delay before that department is re-opened.
- Two staff work spaces have been renovated in Fenelon Falls branch including computer connections to the CKL network. This is part of the first phase of renovations planned for this location.
- Driveway and parking lot of **Dalton Library Branch** and Community Centre has been paved.

Programs, Outreach and Partnerships

Programs/Services

- Lindsay branch is adding supportive enhancements for StoryTime participants
 living with sensory sensibilities staff have been utilizing Visual Schedule cards
 that are placed on a magnetic easel so everyone knows a predictable path for
 the program. Staff are also trialing lighting options relying on natural light and
 turning overhead lights off as bright white lighting can be triggering for many.
- Local author Heather Bradley visited a recent Thursday Storytime in Lindsay as a special guest reader to read from her new alphabet learning book "My Apple." There were 17 participants for this event.
- 19 people booked one-on-one tech learning sessions at Lindsay branch.
- 30 teen boxes were distributed once again this summer. These boxes were space themed and included galaxy slime, an invisible ink pen, space stickers, rocket candies and more. Personal book recommendations were prepared for each registrant by library branch staff.

Outreach

- Library staff attended the Classics on Kent event on July 21st from 9am-3pm. A
 booth with library services pamphlets, program calendars, and colouring pages
 was located outside of the library building. Outreach staff distributed around 75
 Summer Reading Club brochures along Kent Street
- Library staff attended a local history and genealogy workshop in Bobcaygeon on July 24th. The Kawartha Lakes Heritage and Planning program hosted this event, along with attendees from the Kawartha Lakes library (myself), Kawartha Lakes museum and archives, and Trent University library and archives. A 15-minute presentation was done by myself, addressing the libraries physical and digital archival collections, information regarding the reference department and

the services that they offer. After presentations were completed, patrons were encouraged to talk amongst attendees with any questions or concerns. 12 interactions were made that evening

- Library staff have been attending various camps throughout the summer months:
 Compass Early Learning and Care, Lindsay Recreational Center and Leslie
 Frost's Schools Cool program. The library specialist begins their visit with an
 introduction from the library, an interactive story book, followed by three stations
 of activities that students can rotate through. A library services pamphlet, along
 with an SRC brochure was provided to take home. This summer, outreach staff
 connected with 69 students.
- Library staff hosted outdoor pop-up story times throughout the Kawartha Lakes this summer. Kinmount Park, Bobcaygeon beach, Bethany Community Park, and the Edwin Binney Community Garden Centre were all pop-up locations.

Partnerships

- The library has arranged for CKL Heritage Officer Emily Turner to visit all 14 branches to promote and discuss the City's proposed archaeological plan during its consultative phase
- The library has arranged for CKL Environmental Services staff to attend branches on TLDSB PA days and over March Break to discuss ways families can divert material from landfills and also inform the public on proposed composting services coming to Bobcaygeon, Fenelon Falls, Lindsay and Omemee
