## **Programs, Outreach and Partnerships**

## **Programs/Services**

- Noon Year's Eve Party Lindsay families welcomed in the New Year a little early at the library with party hats, snacks, and fun. Over 120 people attended.
- Registration for the winter Teen subscription boxes opened on Saturday,
  December 6 with 30 patrons registering. Boxes were distributed in early January.
  Special items in these boxes included a snowman making keychain and
  materials to make library book bags along with personalized reading
  recommendations.
- The Library handed out 100 literacy packs in honour of Family Literacy Day on January 27. With a theme of "learn to be green together", the pack included suggested activities for families to do together, plus supplies for an activity – creating a plant terrarium.
- The Library added new items to the **Library of Things** collection in early 2025, including snowshoes, a bike repair kit, a decodable pen and more.
- The Bobcaygeon, Fenelon Falls, Kinmount and Lindsay branches each hosted an adult Vision board program in January 2025. This event is part of the monthly Craft & Connect program and is the first of many special adult craft events planned for 2025 that will feature different mediums and skills.
- Kinmount Branch has launched a weekly Adult Social Time on Tuesday
  afternoons. Activities will include board games, crafts, trivia, guest speakers and
  more. Fenelon branch will start weekly Adult Social Times in February with more
  branches offering this type event over the course of 2025.
- Kawartha Lakes Public Library annual Readers' Choice Awards runs from November 30 – February 28<sup>th</sup>.
- Former Ontario MPP David Warner launched his memoir "Against the Odds:
   The Life and Times of an Accidental Politician" at Lindsay library branch. Mr.
   Warner served as an Ontario MPP for four terms through the late 1970s to the mid-1990s, making history as the first Speaker elected by his peers and the first NDP Speaker.

- Local lawyer Hilary Angrove offered a free Wills and Estate Planning clinic on January 23 at Lindsay branch. Approximately 20 people attended this event to learn the basics of how to get their estate and will in order.

- Library staff took part in Santa Parades in Lindsay, Dunsford and Coboconk.
- Library staff attended Literacy Day events at Ridgewood Public School and St Dominic's Catholic School on Monday January 27.

## **Partnerships**

- The Fenelon Falls Branch participated in that community's **Santa Day**. The Library offered a Christmas Craft and 366 people visited the branch.
- CKL Waste Services was at Lindsay branch on December 7 to provide information to the public on the upcoming Source Separated Organic curbside collection program.
- Kawartha Lakes Haliburton Ontario Health Team have attended Lindsay, Bobcaygeon, Omemee, Fenelon Falls and Little Britain branches to conduct surveys on understanding the health needs of our community and boosting community involvement.
